



FACT SHEET

El Buen Samaritano is a nonprofit and outreach ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas committed to helping Latino and other families in Central Texas lead healthy, productive, and secure lives through high-quality and affordable health-care, education, and economic-stability services.

- In its 25 years of service, El Buen Samaritano has grown from a 6,000-square-foot space to a three-building, 11-acre campus.
- El Buen Samaritano's earliest form of support came from church bake sales. Today, El Buen is funded by local, regional and national foundations, local businesses and City, State and Federal dollars.
- In 1993, El Buen Samaritano served 9,050 hot meals and distributed 1,400 food pantry bags. Today, El Buen Samaritano provides food assistance to a monthly average of 1,400 individuals.
- In 1993, El Buen's family health center saw 350 people, almost doubling the amount from the previous year. In 2011, the Wallace Mallory Clinic served more than 6,000 patients, expanding services by nearly 30 percent annually.
- In 1999, El Buen distributed Thanksgiving Care Packages (turkey baskets) to nearly 500 families in need during the 9th annual Hands for Hope Thanksgiving Event. Last year, a record amount of 1,400 care packages was distributed during the Hands for Hope Thanksgiving Event.
- More than 1,100 students go through El Buen Samaritanos' English as a Second Language classes and over 330 children complete the CLC preliteracy curriculum every year.
- El Buen Samaritano provides over 500 children and 26 families with presents and provisions needed to enjoy a Christmas celebration during its Annual Breakfast with Santa Event.
- Today, El Buen Samaritano helps more than 12,000 people annually with the help of approximately 600 volunteers.
